The plenary session on **Creation and Chaos: Reconsideration of Hermann Gunkel's *Chaos Kampf Hypothesis*** will be presented on Friday, February 11, 2011, at 7. p.m. in the Wisner Auditorium by **W. G. Lambert** (Professor Emeritus of Assyriology at the University of Birmingham and Fellow of the British Academy), **Wayne T. Pitard** (Professor of Religious Studies and Director of the Spurlock Museum at the University of Illinois), and **Bernard Batto** (Professor of Religious Studies at DePauw University). Professor Lambert will speak on Mesopotamian creation accounts and *Chaos Kampf*. Professor Pitard will speak on the Ugaritic Baal Epic; and Bernard Batto will speak on Reassessing Rebecca Watson's work on *Chaos Kampf*.

Matthew Waters (University of Wisconsin at Eau Claire; Midwest AOS President) will present Saturday evening's annual **Presidential Address** entitled "An Evening with the Elamites: Elam c. 600 BCE through Jeremiah and Other Sources."
